#### Brandon Lodge Helps Provide Christmas in the Community! Written by Mary Lou Scribner, PER

For the third year the Brandon Lodge was invited by the Florida Elks State Association to be part of the annual **Walgreens Community Care Christmas Toy Drive**. This project is chaired and organized for our lodge by our **Brandon Past Exalted Rulers Association (PER), chaired by PER Mary Lou Scribner.** 

Surely you have all noticed the Christmas donation boxes at our local Walgreen Stores with the label **"COMMUNITY CARE GIFT DRIVE, Cosponsored by Florida Elks State Association?** And hopefully you might have even donated to it?

Walgreens collected toy donations during the Christmas season (from November 24<sup>th</sup> to December 15<sup>th</sup>) and our PER's are assigned to pick up the toys and deliver the toys to our lodge for sorting and distribution into the community.

This year the PER's gathered a total of 1,003 toys. Seriously! It was a ton of hard work, especially as we PER's are not getting any younger. The toys get heavy and the backs start aching, but it truly was a labor of love to be sure.

After much discussion between the PER's as well as our Lodge Officers, the toys were spread out into the community as follows:

Paula Tarver, one of our dedicated Elk's Children's Therapist, was contacted and invited to come to our lodge on Monday, December 16<sup>th</sup> to choose toys that would be beneficial to her and our other Therapists in working with the children during therapy. I do believe we exceeded Paula's wildest dreams as we excitedly helped identify toys that we thought might be useful. Paula took home a lunch table full of toys that will be put to good use and will benefit the community and our children. She was thrilled to receive a "balancing bike", which she was just getting ready to purchase out of her own personal funds. These toys will definitely touch the lives of children in the community.

Our lodge supports three of our local schools: Yates Elementary, Seffner Elementary and Mintz Elementary, all Title One schools. PER Sharon Hammersla, along with the help of PER Mary Lou Scribner, were like two little kids in a toy store while filling *large* bags of toys to help the schools in making a Christmas for identified children in need. PER Sharon hand-delivered the toys the following day, and the schools were so grateful. Again, our lodge helping and being involved in the community. We are making a difference.



Everyone there that evening helped our **Loyal Knight Jim McCleary** fill bags to provide a festive Christmas to a family of seven children that would otherwise not be celebrating Christmas. **Elks Care – Elks Share**.....supporting the community.

A last minute miracle for the teachers of **Palm River Elementary School** when we learned that their normal budget of \$1,500 was reduced to \$100 to provide Christmas to identified children of families in need. They were invited to come and pick out toys to meet this need. We not only helped the children but were able to help support our teachers. A win-win! The teachers were speechless at the generosity.

**PER George Thomas** and **Carolyn Thomas** identified a need for a homeless family that our local churches help. They were invited to gather toys to provide a Merry Christmas for this family. Supporting our community, helping those less fortunate, being good Elks....that's what we do!

The members of our lodge also generously support our **Brandon** Adopt a Christmas Family Program each year, Chaired by Lecturing Knight Marionette Sexton. Toys were donated for this program to assist Marionette in making sure each child per family received the same number of presents. Don't you remember as a child counting your presents and comparing against the number your siblings received? An old Christmas tradition. Way to go Marionette!

The remaining toys were then bagged up and Leading Knight Mark Vargo and PER/Trustee Rick Weigand delivered to the Shriners Hospital to be used for the children at the hospital. Needless to say the Shriners, who Elkdom has partnered with throughout the years, was elated to receive these toys to replenish their emptying shelves. A toy to a frightened child can help lessen that child's tension and fear.

#### So, it was another Merry Christmas.

We are extremely fortunate that the **Brandon Lodge** has been included in this fairly new program headed by **Development Director Dan Masi, Florida State Elks Association**. Last year our lodge collected 543 toys. This year it increased to 1,003 toys. Who knows what we can collect next year! 

Sign-in sheets are in the lobby, so please sign up and show Plant City and Lakeland how it's done!


